AUTOMOTIVE WASTE DROP OFF CENTERS

Brake Fluid-is alcohol based. It's toxic when ingested.

When bleeding brakes, catch the runoff in a jar. Brake fluid from a jar that's been opened for more than a few months probably has absorbed enough water to reduce its boiling point past the point of safety.

To dispose of new or unused brake fluid, pour it into a container of cat litter. The brake fluid will evaporate within a few days.

As with paint, keep this away from pets and children, and any source of ignition.

Sharps and Unused Prescription Drugs Disposal

Proper Disposal of Unused Prescription Drugs

Federal prescription drug disposal guidelines urge Americans to follow the instructions listed below when disposing of prescription drugs:

- Take unused, unneeded, or expired prescription drugs out of their original containers.
- Mix the prescription drugs with an undesirable substance, like used coffee grounds or kitty litter and put them in impermeable, nondescript containers, such as empty cans or sealable bags, further ensuring that the drugs are not diverted or accidentally ingested by children or pets.
- Throw these containers in the trash

OR

Drop them off at West Whiteland Township Building Police Department

OR

CVS, Walgreens, Rite-Aid, Kroger and Winn-Dixie sell pre-paid postage envelopes (\$3.99) that allow customers to mail unwanted prescription and over-the-counter medications to Sharp Compliance's Texas facility for disposal. Controlled substances are excluded from the program.

Disposal Tips for Home Health Care Waste

The suggested disposal for residents with Sharps (needles, syringes, lancets) is as follows:

1. Place all sharps in a puncture-resistant, hard plastic container. An empty detergent or 2 liter soda bottle or empty coffee can will do. Disinfect with a small amount of bleach.
2. Seal the lid with heavy duty tape and place in with your trash.

PAINT DISPOSAL

LATEX PAINT- is nonhazardous waste! Paint may be solidified (allowed to harden), absorbed and then placed in the trash. Take the top off the paint can, place it outside, away from pets and children and allow it to harden. If the can is very full, absorb the material by mixing it with sawdust, clay based kitty litter or rags. Stir with a stick until all the paint is absorbed. When the paint is solidified it may be placed in the trash bag.

OIL BASE PAINT – take it to the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Events scheduled throughout the year for disposal.

FREON/REFRIGERANT RECOVERY INFORMATION

The Clean Air Act of 1990 requires recapture, recycling, and safe disposal of chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs) and hydro chlorofluorocarbons (HCFCs) used in air conditioners, refrigerators, and freezers as coolant. Under the Act, no one may accept an item containing CFCs and HCFCs for recycling or disposal unless the Freon contained within it is properly removed and the owner/hauler/appliance company can show proof of proper removal. It is also unlawful for any person to knowingly release or vent CFCs or HCFCs into the air. The EPA requires certification for all technicians removing Freon as of 11/14/94. For more information, call the EPA's Stratospheric Protection Hotline at 800-296-1996.

2. PP&L Customers call 1-877-270-3522 for pickup and information ongoing program. Refrigerator must work.
3. Contact the company from whom you purchased the new appliance. Many will take back the old appliance and remove the Freon (fees may be charged).
4. Contact an appliance service center. Check in the yellow pages under "Appliances-Household-Major-Service Repair" for an appliance service center that performs Freon retrieval/appliance disposal. After removal is certified, appliances may be recycled at a scrap dealer. Prices vary, call several centers.
5. Call a local licensed plumber who can drain the Freon and tag the item for bulk collection day.

Information for Residents – Electronic Recycling

What are the requirements for residents under the Covered Device Recycling Act?

On January 24, 2013, a disposal ban on covered devices (desktop and notebook computers, computer monitors, computer peripherals, and televisions). No person may dispose of covered devices or any of its components with their municipal waste. From this date forward, residents will be required to recycle their covered devices (televisions, notebook, computers, computer monitors, and computer peripherals).

Why are they Potentially Harmful?

Electronic equipment contains metals that, if not properly managed or contained, can become hazardous wastes:

- Cadmium - The largest source of cadmium in municipal waste is rechargeable nickel-cadmium (NiCd) batteries.
- Lead - Old monitors and televisions contain a cathode ray tube (CRT) that contains leaded glass. CRTs are the largest source of lead in municipal waste.
- Mercury - Some electronic equipment also contains recoverable quantities of mercury.

Electronics may also contain other materials such as hexavalent chromium, brominated fire retardants, lithium, and phosphorous coatings that, if improperly disposed, can pose a threat to human health and the environment.

What devices are NOT included in the CDRA?

The CDRA definitions of covered device, computer, covered computer device, and covered television device contain a number of specific exclusions, including:

- Televisions with viewable screens smaller than four inches;
- A telephone of any type, including a mobile phone;
 - An automated typewriter, professional workstation, server, portable handheld calculator, portable digital assistant, global positioning system, MP3 player or other similar device;

Devices that are functionally or physically part of:

- Equipment intended for use in an industrial, governmental, commercial, research and development, or medical setting;
- Equipment used for security, sensing, monitoring, antiterrorism, or emergency services purposes;

Equipment designed and intended primarily for use by professional users;

- A component or part of a motor vehicle;
- Devices that are contained in an appliance.

Where can I recycle my televisions, computers, monitors and peripherals?

There are a number of electronics recycling programs currently operating in Pennsylvania that provide collection points where residents can drop-off covered devices and other electronics. (See below)

If a fluorescent bulb breaks – Recommended Practice:

Close off the room to other parts of the building. Open a window to disperse vapor and leave the room for at least 15 minutes. Wear disposable gloves. Scoop fragments with stiff paper and wipe area with a damp disposable paper towel to remove glass fragments. All fragments should be disposed in a sealed plastic bag. Tape can be used to pick up small pieces and powder. Do not use a standard vacuum cleaner. Avoid generating dust. The first time you vacuum, remove bag and dispose in 2 sealed plastic bags.

* Take off lid, dry out paint, discard can without lid; or pour paint into plastic bag with absorbent material (clay based kitty litter, saw dust, rags) place bag and can without lid, in trash. Paint hardener can also be purchased at hardware stores.
